



Getting paid

- Work that pays: Consulting, Services, External funding,
 Writing (some), Honoraria.
- Trade services to curb expenditures.
- Supplement with part-time work if necessary.

Once and For All

- Have a clear vision of the work you want to do
- Ask yourself: Will this thing help me create the kind of work/life I want?
- Be mindful of how you spend your time.
- Remove things you no longer need, use or want.
- Mindfully paint the portrait.
